2	Presentation of the proposed annual budget		
	The Director of Finance presented the annual budget for the Trust including individual Academy budgets.		
	The Chair summarised that the proposal was to approve the budget for the 2017/18 financial year.		
	Trustees asked a number of questions including:		
	 Whether all known cost pressures have been factored in The frequency of communications with the local authority to determine pupil numbers The likelihood and scale of any savings from efficiencies 		
	The Director of Finance confirmed some additional points:		
	All known cost pressures have been taken into account		

- The position shown in the budget proposal had since improved by £58k following the receipt of additional funding from the ESEA
- The Trust held regular meetings with the local authority to refine estimates on pupil numbers
- Efficiency savings were difficult to estimate given the varying timescales on contracts and the need to come up with alternative solutions (e.g. moving away from supply cover insurance to a pooled risk approach)

The CEO added a number points:

- The Director of Finance had successfully kept the trust in step despite uncertainties and a real decline in funding.
- A number of external contracts were now in scope for review and, coupled with workforce remodelling, the Trust was in a good position to make further financial improvements.
- The Director of Finance is to be applauded for the way in which she led such a critical element of the trust's work.

With no further questions or additional points, Trustees unanimously approved the proposed budget for the Trust and its Academies for 2017/18.
